- Open Admission
- May require students to take a placement test to ensure placement into appropriate initial courses.

- October 2021
- Support high school seniors in completing three important college enrollment steps: <u>Residency Determination</u>, FAFSA, and Applications
- Many private schools will waive application fee but most UNC System schools will not waive their fees.
- Beware This date may be after the private schools scholarship deadlines.

RESIDENCY DETERMINATION SERVICE (RDS)

- Centralized residency service for all students seeking in-state tuition
- Required for students seeking to be eligible for NC state grant as part of their state financial aid package

COMPLETE RESIDENCY DETERMINATION

CHECK YOUR STATUS



The state of North Carolina partially subsidizes the cost of North Carolina public college and university tuition for all students whose domicile, or permanent legal residence, is in North Carolina. Residency determination establishes if students should have in-state or out-of-state tuition. Because North Carolina residency status is governed solely by North Carolina statute, lack of eligibility for in-state status in another state does not guarantee in-state status in North Carolina. The residency statute mandates only those who can demonstrate a minimum of twelve months of uninterrupted domicile (legal residence) in North Carolina are eligible for in-state tuition. The statute also places the burden of proof on the student to establish, by a preponderance of evidence, that they are a bona fide domiciliary rather than mere residents of North Carolina.

The Residency Determination Service (RDS) was established in coordination with the University of North Carolina (UNC), the North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS), the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA), and the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities (NCICU) as the centralized

RDS

- Use CFNC account to login
- When complete, student receives Residency Certification Number (RCN)
- CFNC Applications- RCN auto-fills
- Common App- RCN must be entered manually



 - financial considerations based on FAFSA



NEED-BASED AID...

- Family is responsible for costs to the extent of its ability to pay college costs, even if family is not willing to pay (EFC=Expected Family Contribution)
- Provides access and choice
- Annual determination of eligibility (Must complete FAFSA each year in school)



APPLYING FOR FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 OPENS OCTOBER 1st

- Required for all types of <u>federal</u> aid
- Complete at www.fafsa.ed.gov on or after October 1, preceding the academic year...Not www.fafsa.com
- Results sent electronically to institutions listed by student on FAFSA and to the student (if you provide your email address)

OFFERS MAY BE...

- Legitimate offers of information and assistance
 - Example: CFNC.org
- Misleading offers from individuals or companies trying to make money off of unsuspecting parents and students



POTENTIAL SCAMS

- "The scholarship requires a small fee." Never pay a fee to get a scholarship.
- "You are a finalist" for an award you never applied for.
 If you did not apply, it is not a legitimate offer.
- "You can't get this information anywhere else."

Everyone has access to the same information.

- Complete FAFSA beginning October 1st

- Stay active in school and focus on grades.
