**APPLICANT/SCHOOL INSTRUCTION SHEET**

**Eligibility:**

1. Student must be a graduating high school senior.
2. Student must be pursuing a higher education with a degree. (i.e. Junior College, Community College, Technical College or University)
3. Student must support conservation and preservation of hunting and fishing heritage. A copy of current hunting or fishing license is required.
4. Student must complete application.

**Selection Process:**

1. Student or High School will submit completed applications and required attachments to address on application by January 1<sup>st</sup>.
2. Chapter will read and give 1-10 score on each part of application. The highest score of 1 boy and 1 girl will win scholarship.
3. The winners may be notified beginning of April and will be asked to attend Hunters Helping Kids – Southern Journey Chapters Conservation Banquet in April.

**Scholarship:**

- 1 \$250 Scholarship for boy
- 1 \$250 Scholarship for girl
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**Disbursement of Funds:**

Students may use to scholarship to any accredited institution of higher education and must be used for tuition, books, fees or housing. Hunters Helping Kids – Southern Journey Chapter will work with student and the college financial aid office in determining the payee when check is issued. This will ensure the greatest benefit to the recipient and avoid violation of eligibility requirements. This is a one-time award for recipient.
